Public Comment

Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to two minutes per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board.

SB 411 Updates:

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a

disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1.

The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time.

Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate.

(i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph, to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed.

(ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.

(iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.

Harbor Gateway North Neighborhood Board Meeting

Tuesday, March 12, 2024 Held via Zoom webinar

Present: Joan Jacobs (Vice Chairperson), Rosalie Preston (Secretary), Keith Pitts (Treasurer), Laivern Frerichs (District 1), Nita Stonehocker (District 2), Dave Trejo (District 3), Arvie Powell (District 4), Eva Cooper Pace (District 5), Marvin Bell (District 6), Oscar Ruiz (District 8), Frankie Mays (Community Organization), Jackie Jackson (Youth Advocate), Elijah Thomas (Youth Advocate), Will Yates (Outreach/Communications Representative), and Craig Kusunoki (At Large Representative)

1) Welcome/call to order/Board roll call: In the absence of Chairperson Miguel Vazquez, Vice Chairperson Joan Jacobs called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. The roll call determined that a quorum was present.

2) General public comment on non-agenda items that are within the Neighborhood Council's subject matter jurisdiction: There was none.

(Eva Cooper-Pace entered the meeting at 7:04 p.m.)

4) Administrative motions

a) Approval of the February 13, 2024, Board minutes: It was moved by Keith Pitts, seconded by Frankie Mays, and passed 11-0-1 (Kusunoki) to approve the minutes with typos corrected.

(Elijah Thomas entered the meeting at 7:06 p.m.)

b) Approval of the February 2024 Monthly Expenditure Report: Treasurer Keith Pitts went over the various expenditures. The net amount available after all expenditures to date and encumbered funds is \$18,463.78. It was moved by Rosalie Preston, seconded by Frankie Mays, and passed 10-0-0 to approve the Monthly Expenditure Report.

(Will Yates entered the meeting at 7:11 p.m.)

c) **Approval of up to \$350 to support the April clean up day in District 7:** Some concern was expressed because details for the proposed clean up day were not yet worked out. Secretary Rosalie Preston explained that once District 7 Representative Barbara Tyson-Frazier was back in town at the end of the week, the date would be set and an itemized budget for the refreshments would be worked out so that the Event Approval form could be submitted thirty days before the event. Funding will not accept a funding application without a detailed budget. The Neighborhood Council can print flyers and volunteers can deliver them around the clean up site, which will probably focus on San Pedro Street under and around the 105 freeway. Flyers can also be left at the 118th Street School. Council District 15 Field Deputy Nicholas Chavez said that his office can coordinate the delivery of dumpsters and tools for the clean up. It was moved by Rosalie Preston, seconded by Frankie Mays, and passed 9-0-1 (Powell) to approve the expenditure.

3) Reports

b) **LAPD**: Senior Lead Officer Robert Martinez said that there has been an upsurge in G13 graffiti around Gardena Blvd. recently. Two Gang Impact Team officers have been assigned to the area. There was a homicide on March 3 at the El Diamante Sports Bar, 12002 S. Figueroa Street, of a man with South Los gang affiliation. Then on March a homeless man wearing a green t-shirt was shot and killed at 15100 S. Vermont Avenue as he was mistakenly thought to be a G13 gang member. LAPD will have extra patrols in the area, as a result.

(Jackie Jackson entered the meeting at 7:15 p.m.)

LAPD and Sanitation have coordinated on cleaning up the trash on the 130th and 132nd Street cul de sacs to the west of Figueroa Street. The RVs which have been parked on both blocks will be removed. Officer Martinez worked with Council District 8 and now the three RVs which had been parked on the south side of Imperial Highway to the east of Hoover Street have been removed. John Ross, who has been living in an abandoned house in the Merit Tract (where his deceased mother previously lived) was charged with battery of a U.S. Postal worker and is now in custody. The assault may be considered a Federal crime and therefore involved a longer sentence. He had also been reported for trespassing on other people's property. Senior Lead Officers from Council Districts 15 and 8 have been working together on clean ups of encampments and RVs. He is working on making contact with t homeless man living in the alley south of the 700 W. block of 132nd Street. On Tuesday March 19 from 6-9 p.m. there will be a Public Safety Town Hall held at the Gardena City Hall, which will include Gardena police, LAPD, Sheriffs deputies, and the Highway Patrol.

c) Mayor's Office: Jocelyn Dominguez, the Mayor's Representative for the Watts and Harbor areas, said that the Mayor's Office had coordinated an Inside Safe update for Harbor Gateway North stakeholders on February 22 regarding the encampment removal at Hoover Street around the 105 freeway. This area is still clear, but information was given out on how to report if any homeless people return. She thanked the Board members who had attended, including District 6 Representative Marvin Bell. This week is designated 311 Week and there is a friendly competition among the fifteen Councilmembers for which District reports the most 311 calls. If the Neighborhood Council has organizations or schools who are interested in 311 training, Jocelyn will arrange for those. Choi was sworn in on March 1 as the Acting Chief of the LAPD. He is the first Korean American to lead a police department in the United States. LAPD had 300 applicants for positions last month. Mayor Bass led a delegation to Sacramento that led to \$300 million to reimburse the City for pandemic-related expenses. Jocelyn said that Mayor Bass and Governor Newsom also have an agreement to keep freeway underpasses and areas near freeways cleared. The City of Los Angeles handles the clean ups and then receives reimbursement from Caltrans. Mayor Bass, City Councilmembers Krekorian, Parks, and Yaroslavsky, and other civic leaders traveled to Paris to meet the Mayor of Paris to discuss how they are preparing for this summer's Olympic and Paralympic games there and received tips on how Los Angeles can be prepared for its own Summer Olympics in 2028. After a question about the lights still being out under the 105 freeway at Main Street, Jocelyn Chavez said that technically it should be Caltrans responsibility but to work with CD 15 on the issue. Senior Lead Officer Tyson Hamaoka said that in the past year, Caltrans has said that it is the City's responsibility and so now Council District 15 is working on getting the lights back on.

d) Los Angeles County Supervisor 2nd District: No one was present.

a) **CD 15**: Field Deputy Nicholas Chavez said that repairing the lighting on Main Street under the 105 freeway has been delayed because so many lights throughout the City of Los Angeles have been damaged by copper wire theft vandalism. Various alternative means of powering the lighting are being tried out, including solar panels. The Harbor Gateway Community Plan update was considered by the City Planning Commission, which voted to approve it. It now goes to the City Council's PLUM Committee, possibly around June. Other thefts of metal objects in the City are the metal covers for sewer and utility openings and metal plates used to cover holes during major work on repairing the roads. Use 311 to report street repairs that are needed and obstructions, such as a fallen tree that recently happened at Main Street and 118th Street. Councilmember McOsker got funding in the City budget for the Clean 15 Team and they regularly address the common illegal dumping sites. 117th Street from Main to Spring Street was recently resurfaced and will now have its speed humps put in. 118th Place from San Pedro to Main Street was resurfaced. Bureau of Street Services is opening the speed hump application on March 21. Eligible streets must be residential, one lane in each direction, and with a 30 miles or less speed limit. The organizer must obtain a certain number of signatures from others on the block in order to apply. Nicholas will find out which schools in the HGNNC area are on the list for speed humps in front of their campuses, something that the City Council voted on last year. The Port of LA has opened grant applications for eligible 501c3s, which must have a nexus to the Port. Applications are due on May 6 and there will be an application workshop on April 10.

e) Phillips 66-Marine Terminal and Wharf Improvement Project – Berths 148-151: Lola Owolabi, Environmental Team Lead for Phillips 66, discussed the project which brings the Terminal in compliance with regulations of the State of California Lands Commission, regulations which apply to all marine terminals in the State. The new concrete Berths will replace the existing timber wharf at Berths 150-151 in compliance with Marine Oil Terminal Engineering and Maintenance Standards (MOTEMS). Operations will not be expanded. Final approval must come from the Board Commissioners of the Port of Los Angeles. The Draft EIR will be released in April with a 45 day public comment period. The Final EIR should be released in the third quarter of 2024. Fuels from the Phillips 66 terminal will be transported through existing pipelines. District 4 Representative Arvie Powell noted that Phillips 66 needs to keep the area on the periphery of their property at 135th Street and Broad way free of weeds and trash, as a safety measure, and noted that the Union 76 plant nearby keeps their property and periphery well-maintained. Mary Perez, Senior Advisor -Field Communications for Phillips 66, said she would look into the matter.

f) Department of Neighborhood Empowerment: Neighborhood Empowerment Advocate Octaviano Rios said that recent training on the Brown Act had been provided via Zoom for Neighborhood Council Presidents/Chairs and that the recording would be available on the DONE website. There will be a Women's Leadership event at City Hall on March 28. Each Neighborhood Council should appoint and register their Homelessness Liaisons. Any Bylaws Amendments need to be submitted by April 1.

5) **Approval of a revised 2023-2024 fiscal year budget:** The modifications to the line items were reviewed. It was moved by Rosalie Preston, seconded by Eva Pace, and passed 10-0-0 to approve the revised budget.

6) Position letters

a) Approval of a letter on HGNNC priorities for the 2024-2025 fiscal year budget: Some additions to the draft letter were mentioned. It was moved by Marvin Bell, seconded by Keith Pitts, and passed 13-0-0 to approve the edited letter.

(Marvin Bell left the meeting at 8:50 p.m.)

b) Approval of a letter to Caltrans on prioritizing assistance with homeless encampments along the 105 Century freeway: The draft letter was read out. It was moved by Keith Pitts, seconded by Arvie Powell, and passed 12-0-0 to approve sending the letter. Nicholas Chavez reminded the Board to report any requests for homeless services or other Caltrans issues via their online Customer Service Request.

7) Committee appointments

a) Public Safety/Emergency Preparedness Committee: It was moved by Joan Jacobs, seconded by Nita Stonehocker, and passed 12-0-0 to approve appointing Board member Rosalie Preston to the Committee.

8) Board business/announcements

a) Reports from Committee Chairs: There were no reports.

b) **Brief announcements from Board members:** Neighborhood Council Budget Day will be held at City Hall on June 15.

Secretary Rosalie Preston said that the HGNNC is working with Council District 15 and Mayor Karen Bass's office on setting up a business breakfast for later in April or May, primarily focused on the businesses along the Figueroa Street Corridor from 149th Street to El Segundo Blvd.

3) Reports

b) LAPD: Senior Lead Officer Tyson Hamaoka reported that there were six reportable crimes over the past month along Imperial Highway. Over the past three weeks the Southeast LAPD Task Force has removed ten encampments, with 40 people offered housing, 20 referred to services, 107 parking citations, 40 vehicles impounded, 45 requests for service answered, 2 Coffee with a Cop events held, 1 Walk with a Cop event, and 2 handguns confiscated.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:16 p.m.

Re: Council File 21-0420-S49 opposition to granting a PCN approval for Cantasia LLC, 12804 S. Hoover Street

Dear Ms. Garakian:

On April 9, 2024, our Board voted x-x-x to send this letter of non-support/opposition to granting Cantasia LLC approval to operate a retail cannabis store at 12804 S. Hoover Street as part of the PCN (Public Convenience or Necessity) program for the following reasons:

- 1) The cannabis retail outlet would be over the allotment of such outlets allowed by right within the Harbor Gateway Community Plan area
- 2) The location at 12804 Hoover Street is not located on a commercial corridor with foot traffic but on a small, irregularly shaped property in the industrial zone on the west side of the I-110 Harbor Freeway and directly across from residentially zoned properties with apartments and single-family homes.
- 3) The location is within 700 feet of permanent supportive housing known as the El Segundo Apartments, located at 535 W. El Segundo Blvd. It is also close to the Rising Stars Academy preschool, located at 762 W.130th Street and close to the playground of the 135th Street School, with the fencing along Hoover Street just north of 135th Street where much of the cut-through traffic would pass by.
- 4) Although the applicant is applying under the Social Equity Program, the residential community to the west is a social equity community and already has two cannabis retail locations, one at 621 Rosecrans Avenue on its southern boundaries, and one that has been previously proposed at 13222 Estrella, just to the east across the I-110 Harbor Freeway

- 5) The location is located near the I-110 Harbor Freeway on and off ramps at El Segundo Blvd. However, due to the street medians along El Segundo Blvd., it is not accessible from either of those off or on ramps going north or south. Instead, the parking lot for the retail location would be entered from Hoover Street, going either south from El Segundo Blvd. or north from 135th Street and passing a residential neighborhood. This would encourage cut-through traffic into the residential neighborhood.
- 6) In their application dated August 19, 2021, the applicant cited support from the Gardena Police Department, not realizing that although the location has a Gardena postal address, the location is within the City of Los Angeles and serviced by the Los Angeles Police Department

In the event that the application is approved by the City Council, we strongly recommend that the following conditions be included:

- 1) 24-hour security provided by security guards hired from a reputable security company
- 2) Landscaping for the front of the property facing El Segundo Blvd. and for the side of the property facing Hoover Street, including shade trees and weekly maintenance of the landscaping
- 3) Financial support of a company that will weekly remove illegally dumped items and trash from all road surfaces and fencing of the property at 12804 S. Hoover Street
- 4) Review of this application one year after final approval is granted, with allowance for public comment and a public hearing.

We also ask that for future such applications or reviews, a longer period is allowed for review by a Neighborhood Council and notification to impacted stakeholders, such as three months in advance of any scheduled public hearings or license reviews. Notification needs to go to every Board member electronically and also via U.S. mail to the official Neighborhood Council address on file with the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment.

RESOLUTION RULES. ELECTIONS, INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS

WHEREAS, any official position of the City of Los Angeles with respect to legislation, rules, regulations or policies proposed to or pending before a local, state, or federal government body or agency must have first been adopted in the form of a Resolution by the City Council with the concurrence of the Mayor; and

WHEREAS, the City has supported efforts to deploy broadband technology, with an emphasis on expanding access to underserved communities and cutting costs for users; and

WHEREAS, the Los Angeles-Department of Water and Power (LADWP) delivers reliable, cost-effective power to more than 4 million people in Los Angeles, including areas that are located in designated High Fire Threat Districts and disadvantaged communities; and

WHEREAS, the City is responsible for inspecting, maintaining or replacing, and operating over 310,000 distribution utility poles throughout its service territory; and

WHEREAS, installation of broadband infrastructure equipment on electric utility poles must not compromise public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, the City reviews and approves broadband pole attachment applications, including, but not limited to wind loading calculations, safe access to electrical infrastructure, and proper grounding to minimize fire and electric shock risks to the public and utility workers; and

WHEREAS, broadband infrastructure that is incorrectly attached to electric utility poles can unnecessarily increase risk to the public and utility workers for fire, electrocution, and also increase wildfire risks in communities located in High Fire Threat Districts; and

WHEREAS, the City has opposed past legislation, including AB 1027 (Buchanan), AB 2788 (Gatto), AB 57 (Quirk), SB 556 (Dodd) and administrative actions that remove local authority, especially in matters that restrict the City's ability to govern the use of our public infrastructure;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that by adoption of this Resolution, with the concurrence of the Mayor, the City of Los Angeles hereby includes in its 2023-2024 State Legislative Program OPPOSITION to any legislation that seeks to undermine the City's jurisdictional control over its utility assets, including any limits to the City's authority to regulate the timing or placement of wireless telecommunications facilities on such assets.

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RESOLUTION RULES, ELECTIONS, INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS

WHEREAS, any official position of the City of Los Angeles (City) with respect to legislation, rules, regulations or policies proposed to or pending before a local, state, or federal government body or agency must have first been adopted in the form of a Resolution by the City Council with the concurrence of the Mayor; and

WHEREAS, LADWP is working to reduce our reliance on higher cost imported water. To do so, the LADWP is pursuing a multi-pronged initiative that includes stormwater capture, water conservation, recycled water, and groundwater remediation; and

WHEREAS, stormwater capture is an important element of the LADWP's overall plan to enhance our local water supply. The principle involves capturing precious rainfall and runoff from open space and urban lands for either direct use or allowing the water to infiltrate into groundwater basins for future use; and

WHEREAS, today, on average, more than 27,000 acre-feet (more than 8.8 billion gallons) of stormwater is captured each year at centralized spreading grounds where it recharges the San Fernando Groundwater Basin; and

WHEREAS, stormwater runoff that cannot be contained at these facilities is discharged to the Pacific Ocean via streams, rivers, and storm drains; and

WHEREAS, LADWP plans to continue implementing stormwater capture projects that decrease the amount of runoff lost to the Pacific Ocean. Projects include large scale spreading grounds enhancements and smaller scale green streets, rain gardens, and rain barrels; and

WHEREAS, centralized Stormwater Capture Facilities are large-scale operated facilities that are designed specifically to infiltrate large amounts of runoff into underlying groundwater aquifers. LADWP has entered into several cooperative agreements with the Los Angeles County Flood Control District to assist with spreading facilities that recharge groundwater for the City of Los Angeles' future use. Improved storage and intake capacities at the Hansen, Tujunga, Pacoima, and Lopez Spreading Grounds will facilitate increased recharge into the San Fernando Groundwater Basin; and

WHEREAS, distributed stormwater/runoff captures localized dry and wet weather runoff. Dry weather runoff is any runoff that occurs in the absence of rainfall from inefficient irrigation systems, overwatering, A/C condensate, or other wasteful outdoor water use practices, while wet weather runoff occurs as a direct result of rainfall. Distributed projects aim to capture local runoff to replenish underlying aquifers, reduce potable water demand, and alleviate local flooding. Distributed projects are smaller scale projects that can provide water supply benefit at the neighborhood and even residential level; and

WHEREAS, historically in Los Angeles, the storm drain systems are designed to quickly direct rainfall and runoff from impervious surfaces into the storm drain system and ultimately the Pacific Ocean. The system was designed to protect life and property from flood impacts. However, enhancement of existing centralized facilities, the implementation of new centralized facilities, and distributed stormwater best management practices (BMPs) including rain barrels and cisterns, permeable pavers, rain gardens, bioswales, and infiltration basins beneath street medians and parkways can help capture runoff and stormwater instead of letting it flow out to the storm drains, the rivers, and the ocean; and

WHEREAS, LADWP has completed the Stormwater Capture Master Plan, which is an outline for policymakers that explains the LADWP's strategies for the next 20 years to implement stormwater and watershed management programs, projects, and policies in the City of Los Angeles to contribute to a more sustainable local water supply.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that by adoption of this Resolution, with the concurrence of the Mayor, the City of Los Angeles hereby includes in its 2022-2023 Legislative Program, Sponsorship of legislation that supports stormwater permitting reform to allow LADWP to expand its local water supply.
