[b] Arvie Powell:

(Cumulative Impacts of pollution on Stakeholders/Community)

Respiratory illness(es), i.e., increased asthma/asthma symptoms; Economic challenges i.e., loss or drain on income due to health issues; hospitalizations; increased mortality among poor/elderly;

[c] Joan Jacobs: (Effects of pollution on public health)

- {1} Air Pollution: Pollutants (gases and particles) have potential to cause cancer, premature births/deaths, respiratory issues i.e., inflammation of lung tissue; asthma attacks, emphysema, stroke, high blood pressure, atherosclerosis, heart attack, smallest particles can migrate into other organs, can cause brain damage similar to Alzheimer.
- **Noise Pollution:** Contributor to hearing loss, tinnitus, sensitivity to sound. Can cause or exacerbate cardiovascular disease, Type 2 diabetes, sleep disturbances, stress, mental health issues, cognition problems including memory problems and attention deficits, childhood learning delays.
