Chair, **Miguel Vazquez**, will be requested to contact Ms Bettinelli as to her availability for a July, 2023, meeting for consultation with her and for her input on work now in progress by this Committee. In addition, Committee members request the meeting is via Tele-Conference <u>or</u> via **Zoom**.

(b) Target Date for Submitting Recommendations to HGNNC Board: August, 2023, Board meeting.

(c) When to Request HGNNC Board post one of the EJC Tools on website:

Lu Watson suggests a Motion to "post" is placed on the July 11, 2023, Board Agenda for a vote; and that the "*Tool*" is the *EPA Air Quality Forecast*. www.epa.Gov/AirNow

Stakeholders will be able to click on link to monitor air quality in their own neighborhood(s). A potential "catchy" phrase to get attention offered by Members: "*Pollution, If You Care, Don't Wait, Educate.*"

Joan Jacobs cautions about accuracy. The *Air Quality Forecast* reading depends upon how far the location (zip code/neighborhood) is from the monitoring station. It is a factor, has a bearing on the results; and the reading could be misleading.

III. Show studies that were made by AQMD of the presence of silica in the air due to a nearby non-compatible business. Study will be published to the HGNNC website (QR code that redirects people to the Study from the website.)
{EJC Members: Should be included under EJC Recommendations in the category of *Educate/Engage Tools*} (Joan Jacobs might submit an additional *Tool* at later date.)

IV. Include ways on how to get involved in the neighborhood by forming a community scientists advocating and engaging stakeholders of pollution.{EJC Members: Requires clarification.}
